THE PROJECT ORIGINALLY BEGAN IN 2005 AS "HUGS FROM GRAMMY" IN HONOR OF MY GRANDMOTHER WHO SHARED MANY "CHOCOLATE CHIP HUGS" WITH ME THROUGHOUT MY LIFE. SHE LOST HER ONLY SON IN WWII WHO WAS HONORED WITH THE SILVER STAR.

THIS PROJECT CAME TO LIFE WHEN I MET A YOUNG MAN WHO WAS ABOUT TO BE DEPLOYED TO IRAQ. AFTER HIS ARRIVAL IN IRAQ, I LEARNED THROUGH OUR CORRESPONDENCE, THAT MORALE FOR THE TROOPS WAS GETTING QUITE LOW. I BEGAN TO WONDER WHAT I COULD DO TO TRY AND MAKE A DIFFERENCE FOR THESE BRAVE YOUNG MEN AND WOMEN. MY GRANDMOTHER AND ALL THE "HUGS" SHE SENT TO ME IN THOSE CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES WHILE I WAS IN COLLEGE CAME TO MIND.
